

THE BAHNSEN GROUP OPENS NEW PITTSBURGH OFFICE

Company adds Grady Wirth of JP Morgan to its Private Wealth Advisor Group

[Newport Beach, CA] - The Bahnsen Group has opened another new office, this time expanding to Pittsburgh, PA. Grady Wirth, formerly of JP Morgan Wealth Management, will serve as the senior advisor. Sandie Sikora has been hired as the Operations Associate for the new office, and other Planning and Investment hires are underway. The new office is located in the Brush Creek Commons plaza of Cranberry Township, and represents the 12th office location for The Bahnsen Group.

"The western and central Pennsylvania market has long been an area of strong client interest for us for a number of reasons," says TBG Managing Partner, David Bahnsen. "Not only is there a tremendous client base there already, but we are confident it will build into a significant market over time and so having a physical presence and putting resources and talent on the ground there was the logical next step."

The Bahnsen Group has now opened ten offices beyond their flagship locations in Newport Beach and New York City over the last five years. Last month the company added a new office in Silicon Valley, CA. Both that endeavor and this new Pittsburgh office were launched with new advisor hires, as opposed to many of TBG's locations that were launched by re-locating one of the company's other advisors.

"This was not a decision I took lightly," says new Bahnsen advisor, Grady Wirth. "When I was offered the opportunity to establish and lead a new office for a nationally recognized wealth management practice in a city I love, I knew it was the most meaningful opportunity of my career."

The Bahnsen Group manages, as of March 2026, over \$9.5 billion of client assets and remains one of the top organic growers in the industry for a decade running. Other offices besides the flagship locations in Newport Beach and New York City and the 2026 openings in Silicon Valley and Pittsburgh include Minneapolis, Nashville, Austin, Phoenix, Dallas, Palm Beach, Bend, and Grand Rapids.
